Background

Information and Communication Technology (ICT) is of increasing importance within Europe. Much information about social and political life is now only readily accessible on the Internet. According to research, within two years, the majority of Europeans will have Internet access. However, older people in many EU countries have not been actively encouraged to participate in these developments.

Ways of Working

In the EuCoNet project the participants play active roles by reflecting on their cultural experience of learning and using the Internet, and exploring new ways of using a computer, such as e-learning. They exchange and compare information, and review ways of applying what is best from each country.
