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WHY NOT TRY? / IT WOULD BE A GOOD IDEA TO ...

- **1.** Playing games, like the Portuguese, Belgian and Turkish partners played in the Latvian meeting, in which leading and organisational characteristics can be developed in a motivational, enjoyable way.
- 2. Using sports activities as a way of training leadership or team work competences.
- **3.** Whenever possible, devising some outdoor activities (treasure hunting, for example) in order to educate orientation, observation and cooperation abilities.
- **4.** Planning activities that, along with present time goals, like acquiring administrative and interpersonal skills, may also prepare participants to their future retirement, for example, organising a touristic tour, a guided visit, a company's event, yoga classes, etc.

NECESSARY CONDITIONS: MATERIAL / PLACE / TIME

Material: ordinary office material, as paper, pencils, clips, computer and the internet, but also sports equipment, chalk, sticks, etc.

Place: hired rooms or companies' facilities, but outside the regular working place, so participants can decompress from a day's work; sports facilities, indoors or outdoors; the forest, wood, park, town.

Time: after working hours or on Saturday mornings.

POSSIBLE OBSTACLES

Tiredness, unavailability (in charge of children, seniors), lack of enthusiasm and / or motivation.

Opposition from the competent authorities (companies' leaders, council representatives...).
