MAIN IDEAS DEVELOPED

- The round table discussion showed that generally the relationship between local clubs/associations in Ettelbruck region and the Club Senior is distanced
- The staff members of local Associations don't want to take part in common activities with members of Club Senior
- It is necessary to promote the personal contact between the volunteer Staff from Local Associations and the professional Staff of Club Senior Nordstad

POSSIBLE OPTIONS

- Motivating members to attend in common events e.g. visit to the theatre, exhibition
- · Participating together in EU projects
- Finding the common problem for all organisations and trying to solve it together (and fighting together!) e.g the low quality of medical service for seniors in the village, etc.
- Encouraging them to common activities organizing activities such as parties, games (cards, chess) for members/volunteers to make good relationships
- Organising event with the profitable aspect (in emotional contex) e.g. organizing competition named "Volunteer of the year"
- Organizing a big festival with the municipality support
- Disseminating information, providing trainings for managing board, printing brochures for local people
- Trying to know each other

CONCLUSIONS

- This case presented by Luxemburg partners is typical for different organisations in Europe
- Results: they can improve the motivation to learn and work, avoid isolation, improve ability of their life
