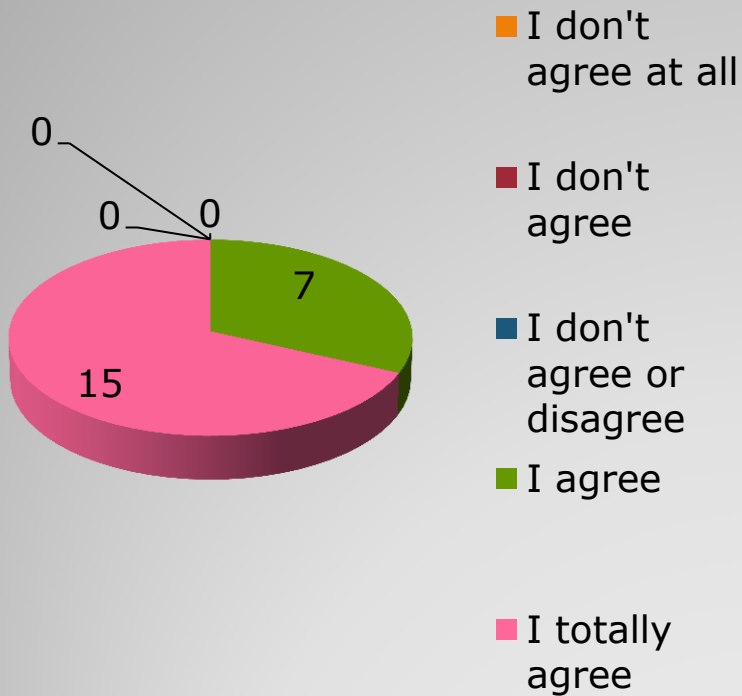

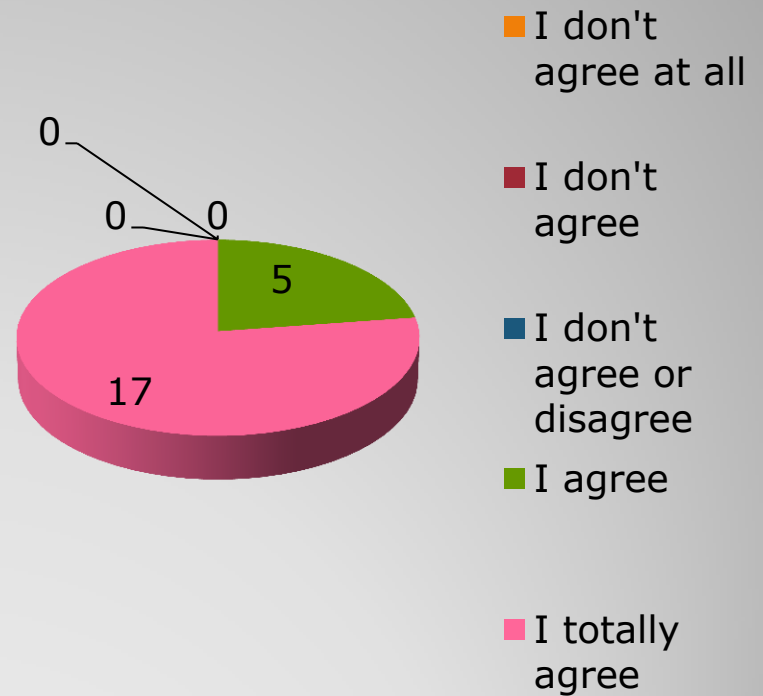

1.1 -You're well informed about what's going on with the project

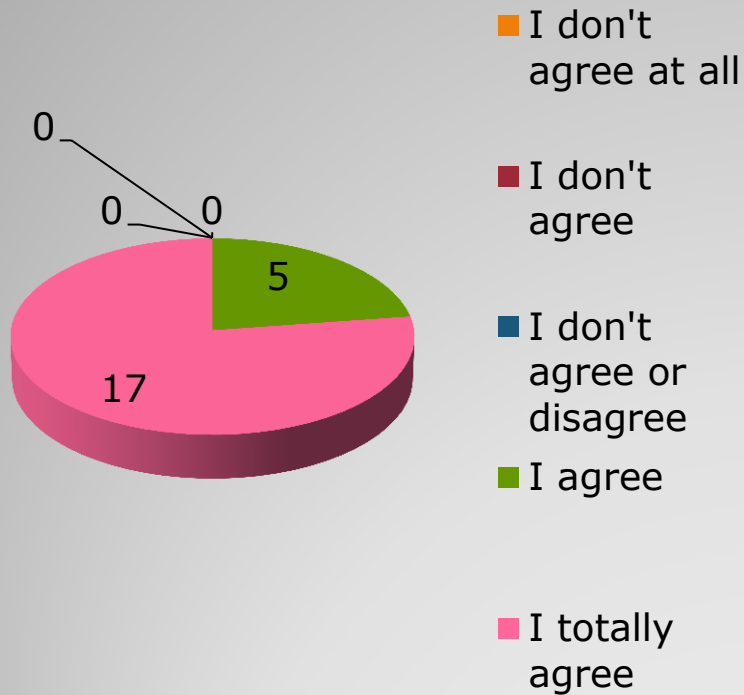


1.2 -You are always informed about what you are expected to do next

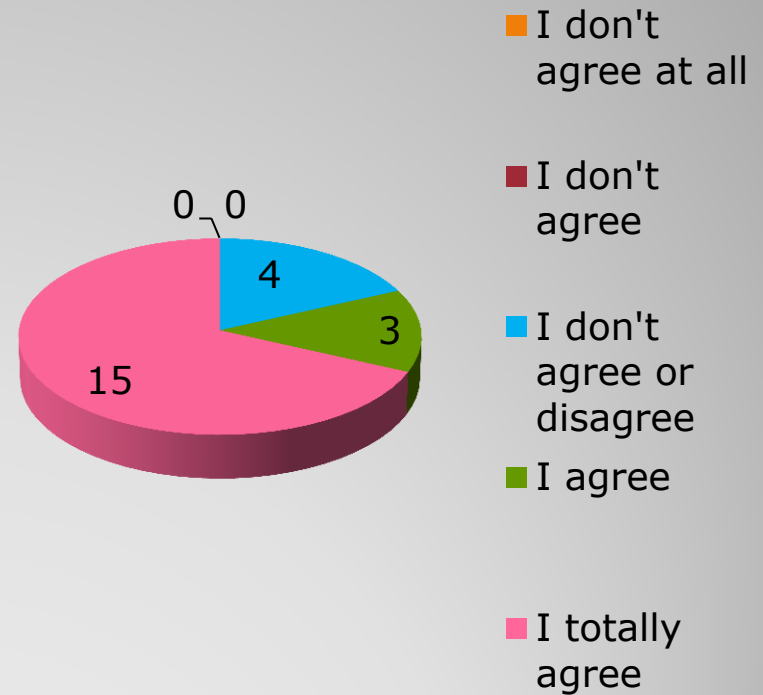

1.3 - You are always informed about what you are expected to do next

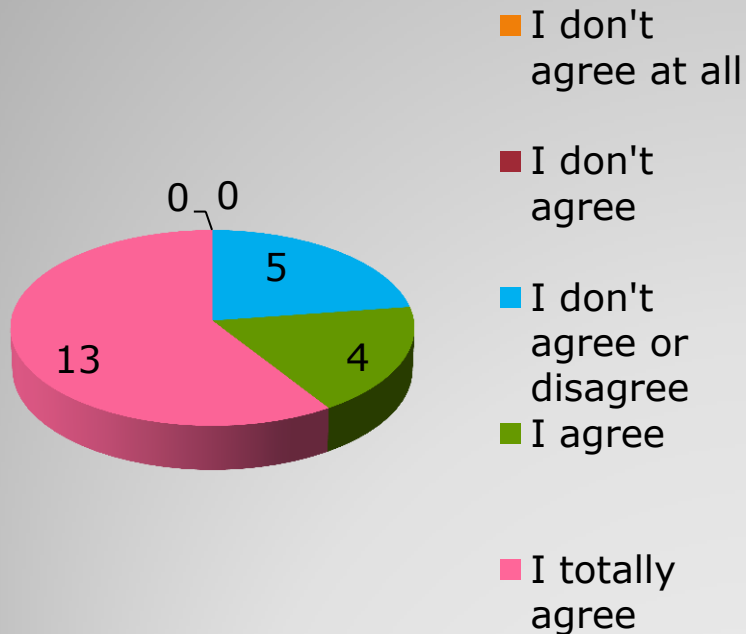


1.4 - You feel you receive appropriate recognition for your contributions

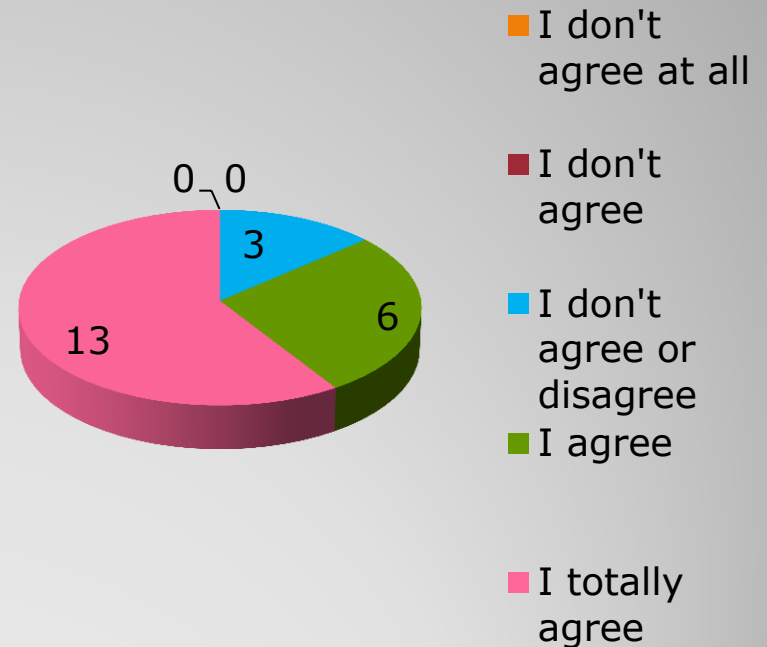

1.5 - You are satisfied with the amount and frequency of informal praise you receive from your work

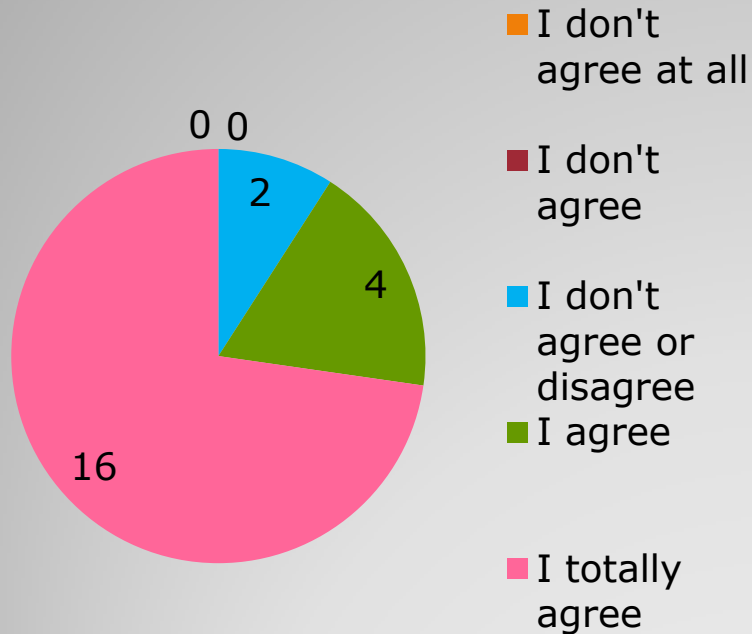


1.6 - There is collaboration and cooperation within the working group

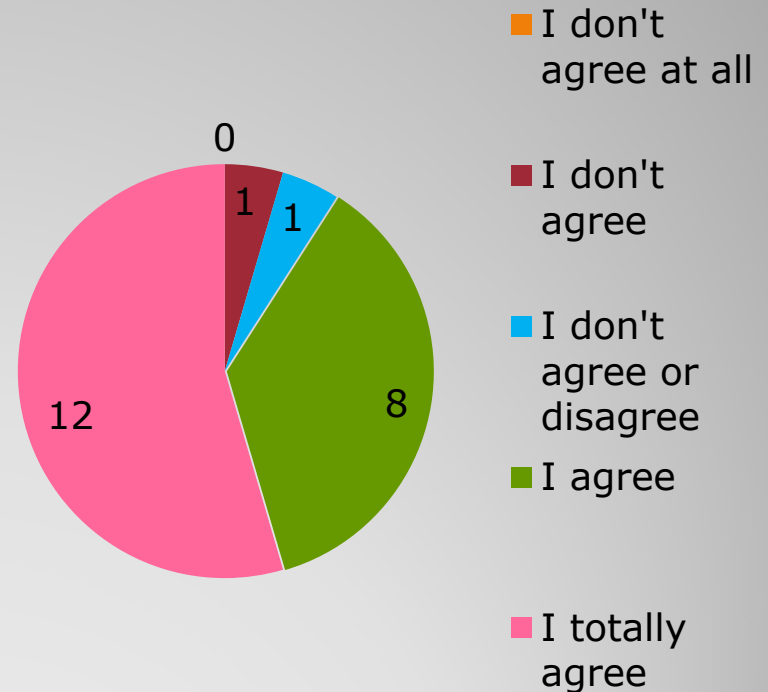

2.1 - You have the opportunity of contributing with innovative ideas

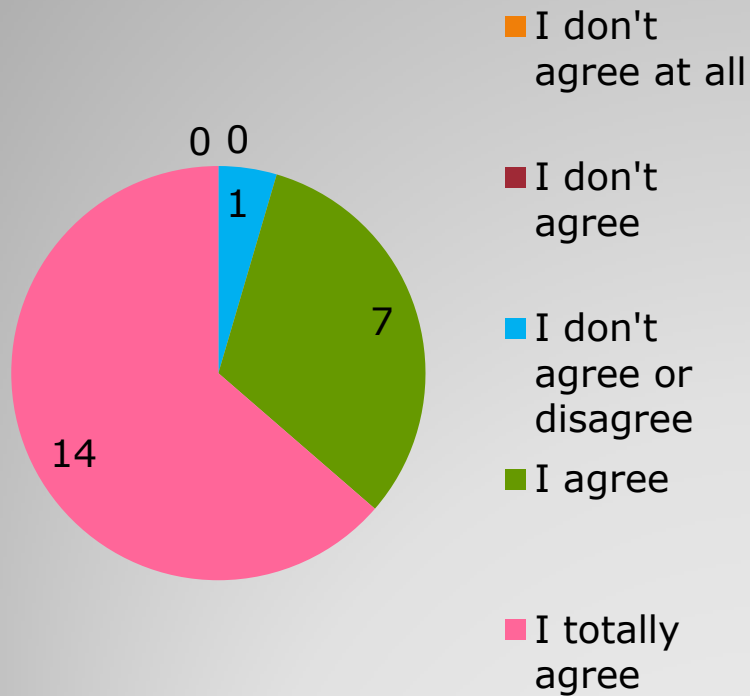


2.2 - You are invited to contribute with innovative ideas

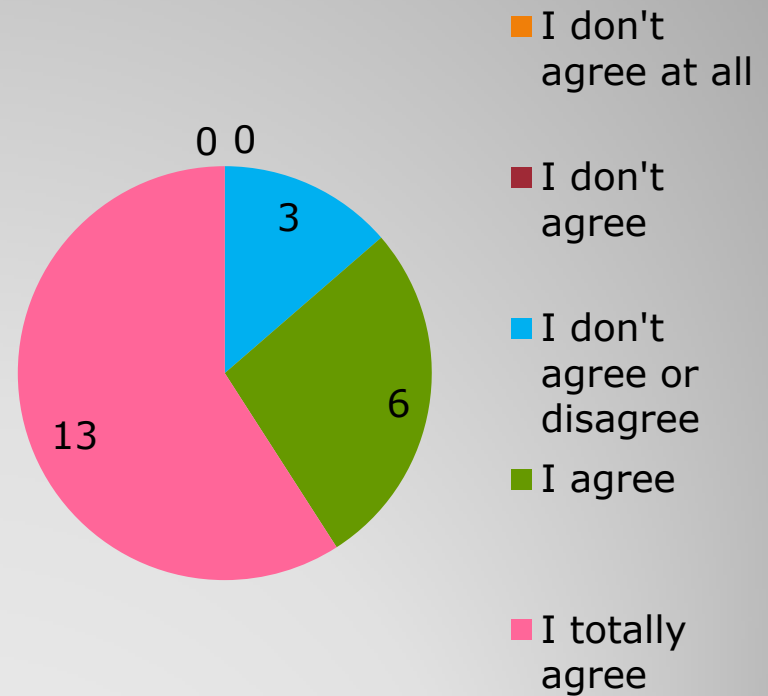

2.3 -Availability for listening and discussing new ideas is total

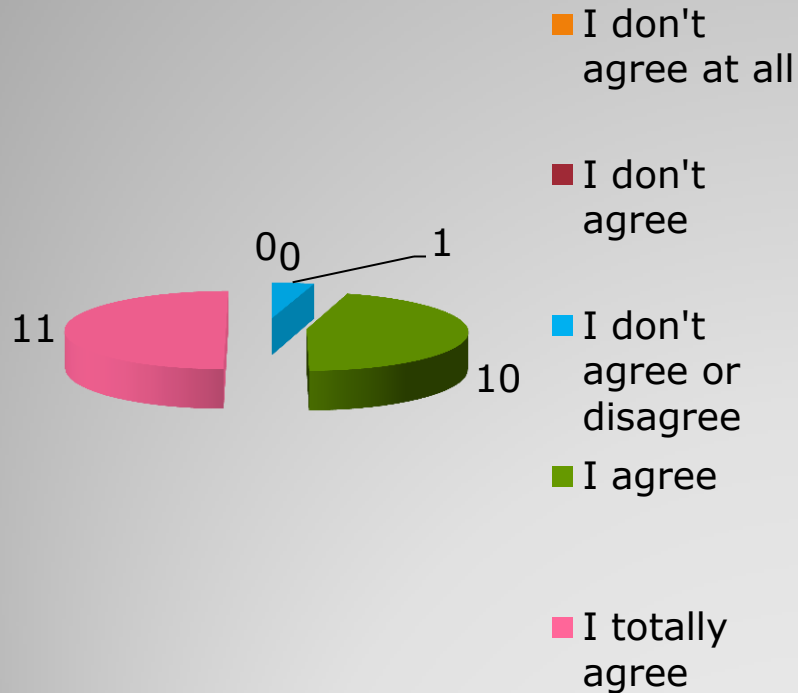


2.4 - Creativity is expected and sistematically valued

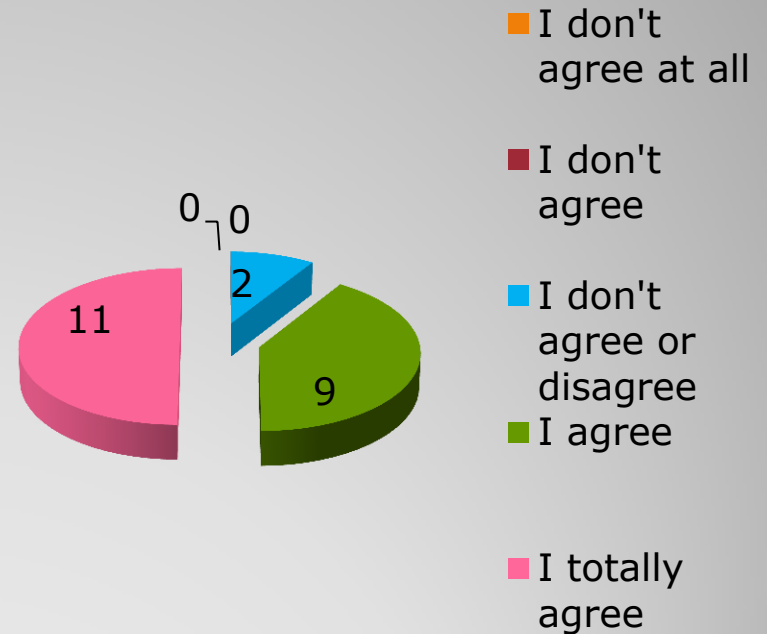

3.1 - You make a contribution to the planning of the activities

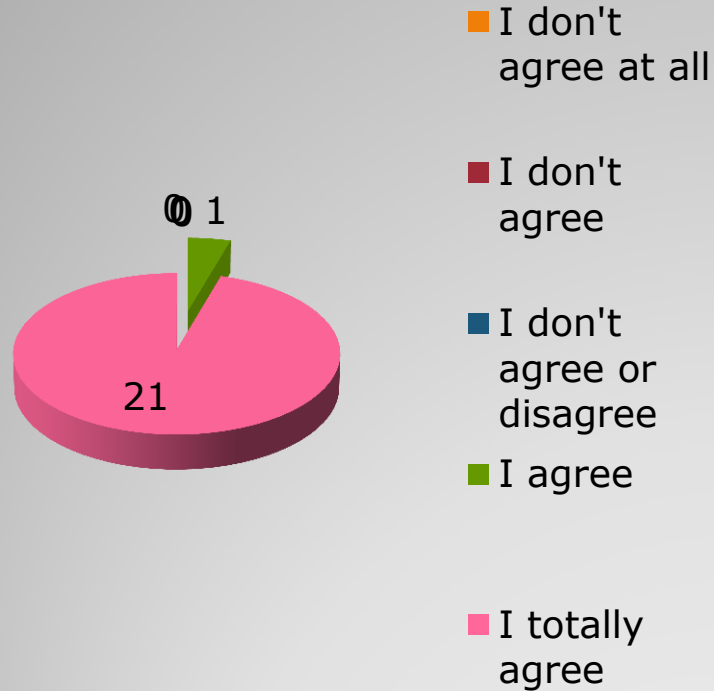


3.2 - The planned activities respond to the issues of most importance to you

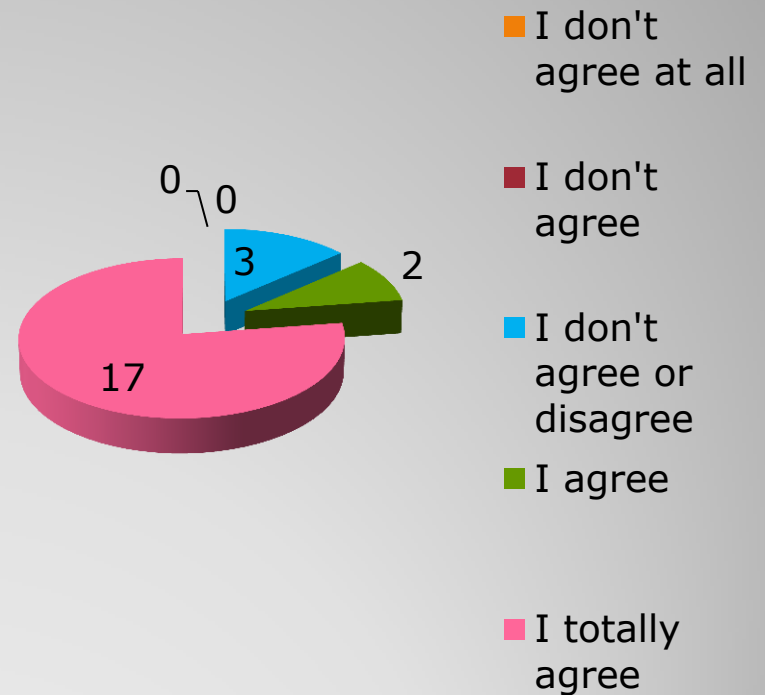

3.3 - You are satisfied to do this kind of work

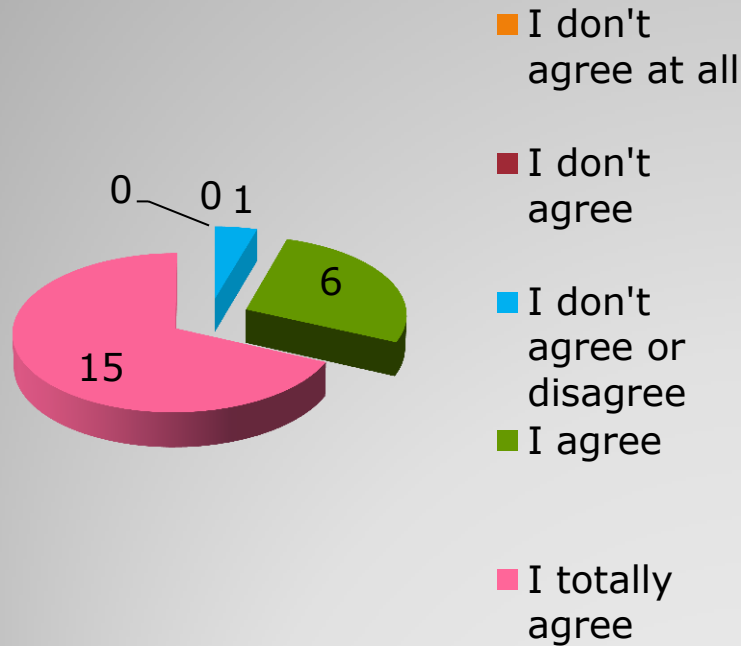


3.4 - You feel more and more committed to the activities of the project

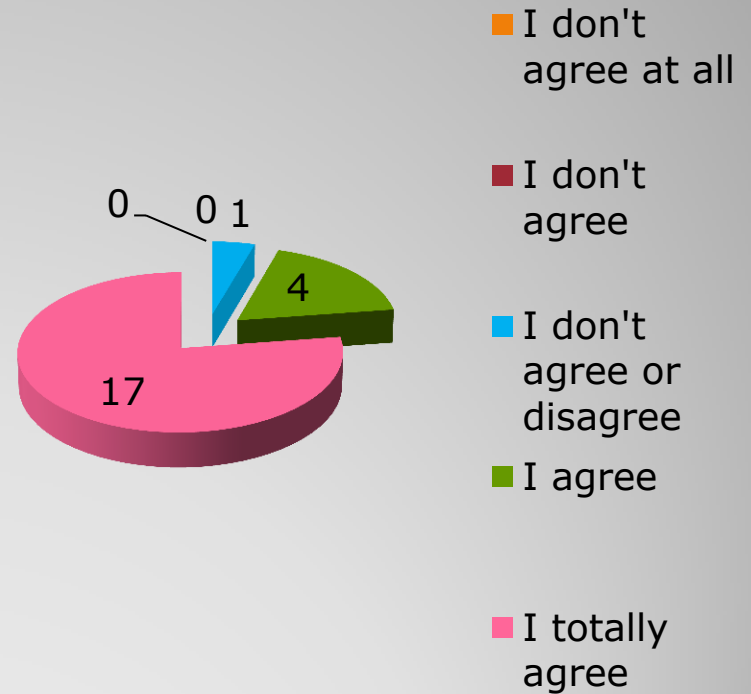

3.5 - You are satisfied with your understanding of the activities and goals of the project

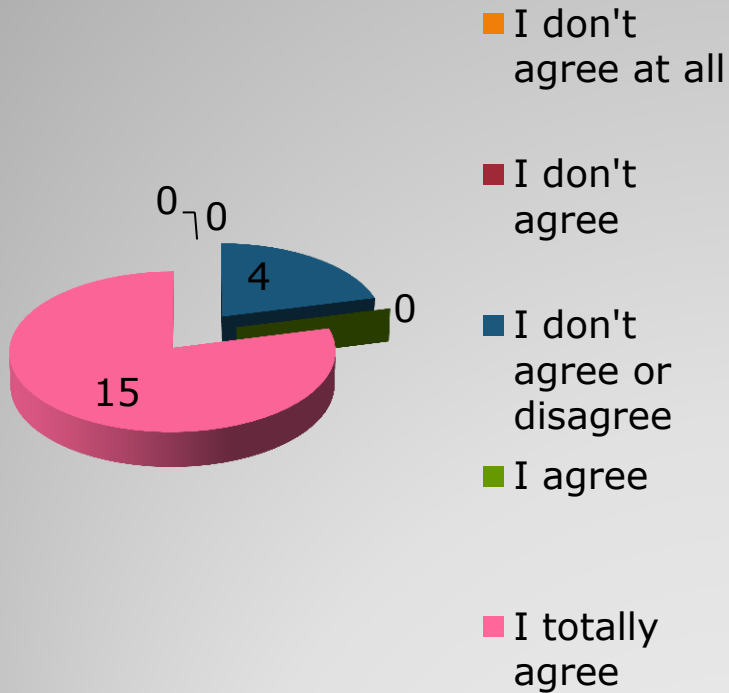


3.6 - You are responding positively to the tasks at hand

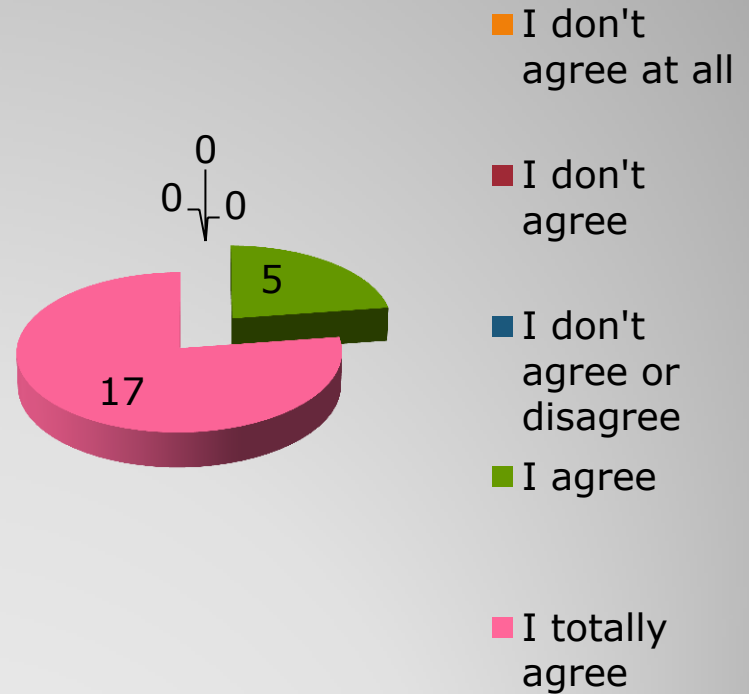

3.7 - Men and women are provided with equal tasks

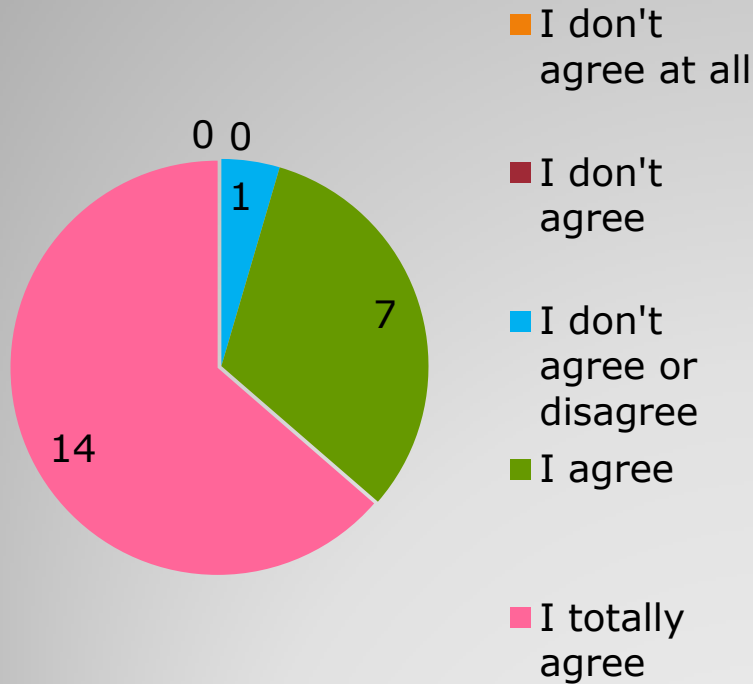


3.8 - The planned activities are usually executed

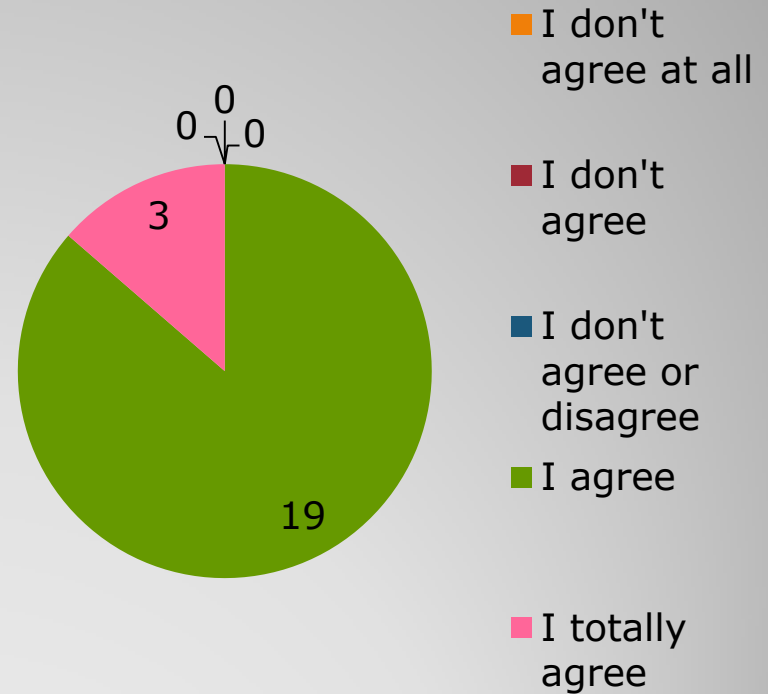

4.1 - Group work was an effective way of accumulating specialized knowledge

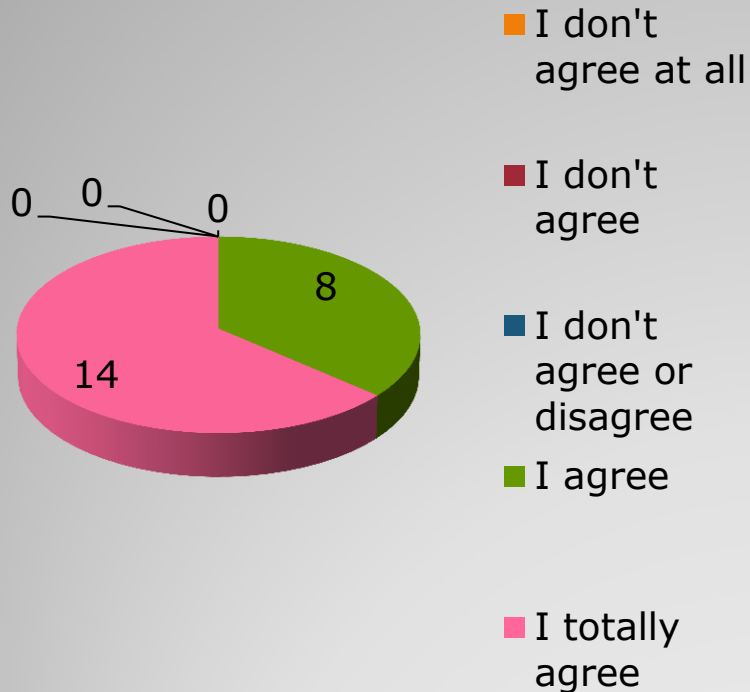


4.2 - Project activities helped you to find a problem and solve it

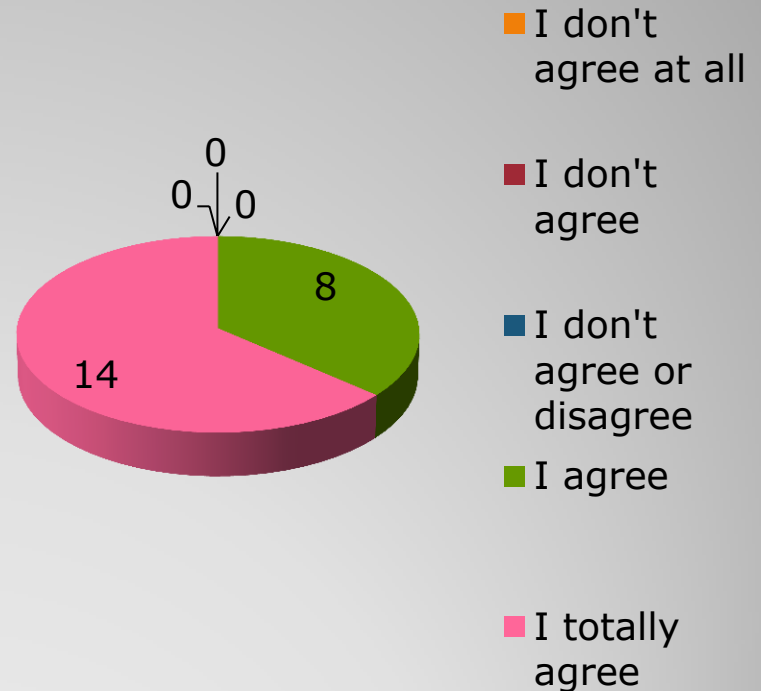

5.1 - You clearly defined goals and objectives

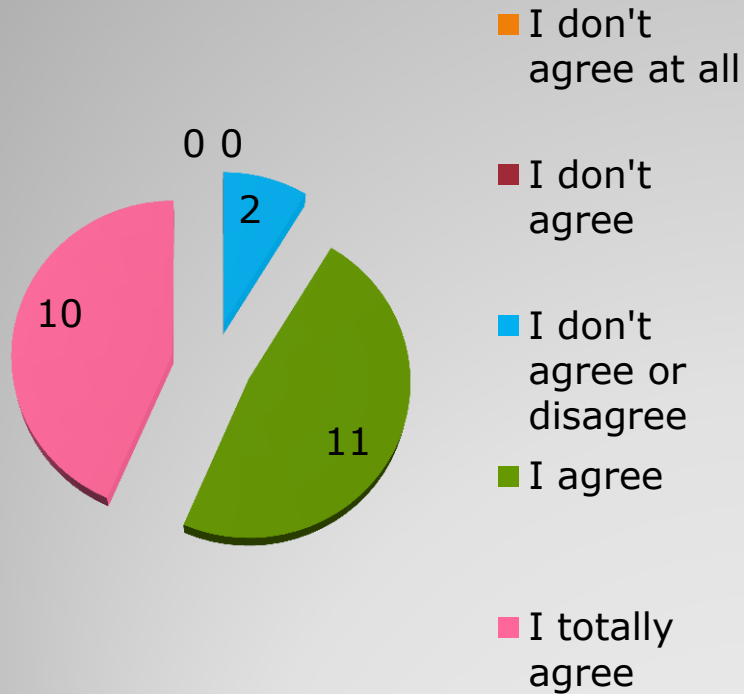


5.2 - Your plan was realistic and viable

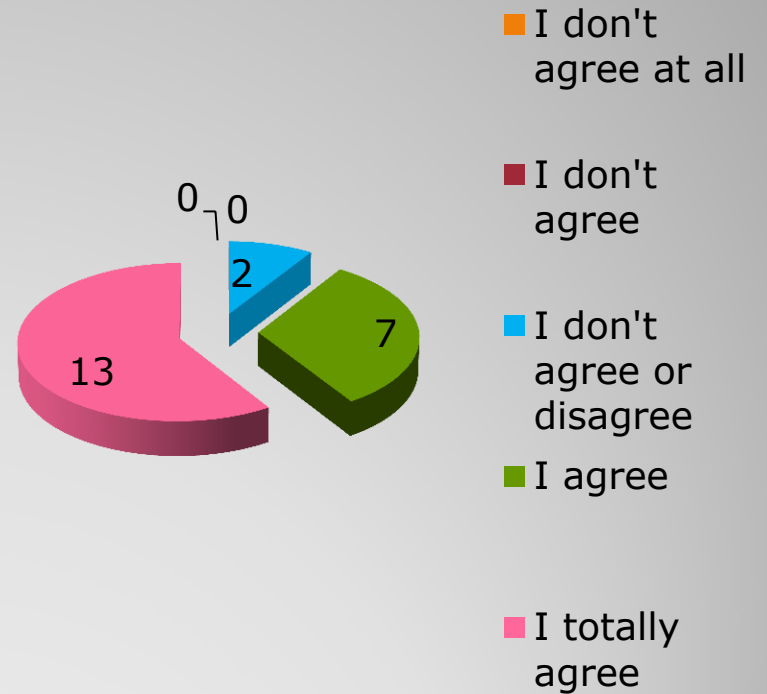

Personal achievement

- 1. A vast majority of the participants present at the Luxembourg meeting has a positive opinion about the planning, the organisation, the development of activities within the Project and about the evolution of learning due to their involvement in it.
- 2. The most consensual subjects for the respondents, being mostly answered with the options "I agree" or "I totally agree" were items 1.2 ("You are always informed about what you are expected to do next"), 3.8 ("The planned activities are usually executed"), 4.2 ("Project activities helped you to find a problem and solve it"), 5.1 ("You clearly defined goals and objectives") and 5.2 ("Your plan was realistic and viable") while item 3.3 is the most positive one with 21 answers in 22 saying they are totally satisfied to do this kind of work.
- 3. However, though expected in such a large group of participants, some elements don't have any opinion or have a negative one about certain aspects of the partnership process:
 - - 4 participants in 22 don't know whether they receive appropriate recognition for their contributions (item 1.4);
 - - 5 participants in 22 are not familiar with the degree and frequency of informal praise they receive from their work (item 1.5);

Conclusions

- - 3 participants in 22 are not sure if there is collaboration and cooperation within the working group (item 1.6);
 - - 1 participant in 22 is not sure whether one is invited to contribute with innovative ideas, while another is sure of the negative option (item 2.2);
 - - 3 participants in 22 don't know if creativity is expected and systematically valued in the project (item 2.4);
 - - 3 participants in 22 aren't sure whether they feel more and more committed to the activities of the project (item 3.4);
 - - 4 participants in 22 aren't certain that men and women are provided with equal tasks (item 3.7).
- 4. Curiously, item 4.2 ("*Project activities helped you to find a problem and solve it*") is the only one in the questionnaire where many more respondents say they agree (19 answers) than say they totally agree with the statement (3 answers).
- 5. From the answers analysed, we can conclude that item 5 of the questionnaire (Learning strategies) is satisfactory for the whole group: all the answers are positive and most of the participants say they totally agree with the statements.
